Aisho is an area crossed by major ancient roads (Tosan-do and Nakasendo) that have traversed Japan since ancient times.

Samurai risked their lives to run along these roads and fought in various parts of Omi.

Today, people who inherit the samurai spirit pray for victory, train in martial arts and continue to refine various cultures.

"The God of Victory" Toyomitsu Shrine ~Miko Kagura Experience and Formal Worship~

At Toyomitsu Shrine, revered as "the god of victory" by the samurai, wear miko attire and perform a formal worship to greet the gods, then receive instruction from a miko to perform kagura.

After the experience, enjoy taking photos in the shrine grounds.

90 minutes
(changing clothes, formal worship, dance, free time, changing clothes)

15,000 yen per person

*Miko attire set (juban, white kimono, scarlet hakama, tabi)
available for purchase (around 30,000 yen)

~Kendo Experience: Beginning and Ending with Respect~

After donning the protective gear, observe a demonstration match by instructors, learn the basics of kendo, and then participate in a match yourself.

Enjoy photo sessions afterward.

Duration

120 minutes
(warm-up, donning armor, observation, lesson, match, free time, changing clothes)

Reception Hours: 10:00-12:00

Afternoon sessions are negotiable.

Fee

15,000 yen per person (includes Kenshinkai hand towel, excluding tax)

Other Conditions

2-6 people per group
